RESOLUTIONS

1. FURTHER DISCUSSION on the following resolution moved by SHRI C.K. CHANDRAPAN on the 6th May, 2005:—

"In view of the demand for ensuring adequate representation to women in the State legislatures and Parliament gaining ground, this House resolves that the Central Government should bring forward a suitable legislation to reserve atleast one-third of the seats for women in all the State legislatures and both Houses of Parliament."

Reservation of one third of seats for women in all the State legislatures and Parliament.

2. SHRI JUAL. ORAM to move:—

"This House recommends to the Government to grant special economic package for the speedy completion of construction of,—

(i) national highway No. 215 between Panikoilli and Rajamunda;

(ii) national highway No. 23 between Barahpal and Ranchi; and

(iii) railway lines from Talcher to Bimalgarh and Daitari to Banspani

in order to facilitate movement of minerals from hinterland in Keonjhar and Sundargarh districts in the State of Orissa to Paradeep Port and for the overall development of the region."

Special economic package for speedy construction of national highways and railway lines in Keonjhar and Sundargarh districts of Orissa.

3. SHRIMATI SUMITRA MAHAJAN to move:—

"Considering that the categorisation of any group of persons in the society on the basis of religion as minority is against the provisions of the Constitution, this House expresses its deep concern over violation of human rights especially women's rights in the name of religious or personal laws and urges upon the Government to abolish such laws which violate constitutional or human rights and to take steps to withdraw reservation and other facilities being provided on the basis of religion."

Abolition of laws which are contrary to the constitutional or human rights, etc.

4. SHRI ABDULLAKUTTY to move:—

"This House urges the Government to bring forward a suitable legislation providing for social control over self-financing professional institutions in the country in the matters relating to admission of and fees charged from students and reservations in employment for persons belonging to Other Backward Classes in such institutions."
